She expressed just how timely the gesture was. On Friday, she was telling a coworker about how she wanted to bake her mother's chocolate cookies, but she no longer had the recipe. Now, thanks to a serendipitous mailing from Ralph Newport, she can once again indulge in the sweetness of her childhood memories.


One more time, here are the highlights about our Appreciative Inquiry Experience this Sunday, April 21:

#### **Appreciative Inquiry Questions**

**1. Best Experience:** Reflect on your entire experience with First Christian Church. Recall a time when you felt most alive, most involved, spiritually touched, or most excited about your involvement. What made it an exciting experience? Describe how you felt. Did anything about this event change you as a church member?

#### 2. Values:

(i) Our congregation: What do you value most about First Christian Church? What is the single most important thing that your church has contributed to your life?

(ii) Being a church member: What makes you feel most connected to your church?

(iii) Our denomination: What is it about being a member of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) that you value? What is the single most important thing that being from your denomination has contributed to your life?

**3. Core Value:** What values give life to First Christian Church? What do you think is the core value of our church? What is it that, if it did not exist, would make your church totally different than it currently is?

4. Three Wishes: If you had three wishes for First Christian, what would they be?
